
Off Across the Fells

Where are they going?




Where have they travelled from?

Whereas, the others were quarrymen mining the slate from the fells at Honister. So their lives would be quite different.

Off Across the Fells



Moses Rigg was a quarryman who used his job to cover up his other trade.....illegal smuggling of whisky or moonshine as it was known! He is supposed to have made good quality roofing slates as well as moonshine. He hid his illegal moonshine in a small stone hut high up on the north side of Great Gable. He clearly sold both of the goods he made!

He was eventually caught and punished for his illegal trade, with a heavy fine he had to pay.
